Discussion

• Shoreline Substantial Development Permit/Exemption

- o DPD staff confirmed that the installation of conduit and electrical line underneath the Viaduct would only require a SSD Exemption.
- o DPD also confirmed that if overhead power poles were needed to transition off the viaduct to the Union Substation a SSD Permit would likely be required; however there was some possibility of an exemption.
- Also confirmed that overhead lines of 115kV or more are an allowed use within the shoreline zone and so no code amendment was required.
- SDOT staff stated that overhead electrical lines were not allowed in ROW in the downtown area so a code amendment would be required for the street use permit if overhead lines are used.

• Temporary Land Use Permit not required for staging in WSDOT ROW

- o Confirmed previous discussions with DPD staff that staging activities occurring within permanent WSDOT ROW does not require a land use permit.
- All areas where staging is occurring for this project are currently identified as WSDOT ROW on official ROW plans.
- o A Director's Rule to further clarify this issue is being drafted.

• Demolition Permit/Review process for buildings on WSDOT ROW

- SDOT and DPD staff stated a belief that demolition of buildings on WSDOT ROW would be reviewed as part of the 30/60/90% plan review for the street use permit and would not require a separate DPD demolition permit submittal.
- o DPD review of the demolition would occur through SDOT/DPD comment coordination in the street use process.
- SDOT staff indicated that street use permit jurisdiction extends to all public places regardless if a designated city street and that title to WSDOT ROW would automatically vest with the City. WSDOT staff believed this may not be the correct interpretation.

Action Items

 Jesse Halsted will confirm with project staff if overhead poles will be required and inform DPD staff.

- Margaret Glowacki will pursue the possibility of using a SSD exemption for the overhead poles.
- Roberta Baker and Sandy Gurkewitz will within their agencies confirm the demolition review process and whether a separate demolition permit submittal would be required.
- Joyce Kling is tracking and coordinating the street use code amendments and proposed Director's Rule.
