Meeting management

- Meetings will be facilitated by the three RPs.
- Set the expectation that at least two of the three RPs will be present at each meeting.

- Meetings will take place during the same week of the month (exception during the month of May when two meetings will be held for the north and south portal working groups).

Technical resources

Each working group will have a technical manager responsible for:

- Reviewing and commenting on meeting agendas.
- Identifying and ensuring technical resources are available within each agency to prepare presentations or other meeting materials in a timely manner.
- Identifying and ensuring technical presenters are available for the working group meetings.
- Ensuring each agency has had an opportunity to review and comment on meeting materials.
- Resolving conflicting comments from agencies.
- Coordinating with external agencies to present or share information with the working groups, including on-going coordination with King County and the Port of Seattle.
- Coordinating with a member of the project communications team.
- Meeting on a regular basis with the WSDOT program director to ensure consistency across the working groups and that input from the working groups is being received and considered in a timely manner.
- Meeting with the RPs on a regular basis to status updates and review materials for working group meetings.

Communication team resources

Communication support will be provided primarily by the project team communications. SDOT communication staff will have some level of responsibility [to be determined]. One communication team member will provide strategic management by:

- Reviewing and commenting on meeting agendas.
- Ensuring there are no conflicts between meeting schedules and times.
- Reviewing meeting materials to ensure consistent information is provided across the working groups.
- Identifying what information presented to each working group should be shared in summary form with the other working groups.

Communication team leads will be assigned to each group and will have responsibility for:

• Preparing draft meeting agendas and circulating for review.

- Supporting technical managers and team resources in preparing schedules and work plans to prepare for working group meetings.
- Reviewing and preparing meeting materials.
- Staffing working group meetings.
- Taking notes and tracking action items from working group meetings.

Logistical support

Expectations will be set for logistical support provided by the agencies, which may differ from the type of support provided during the SAC process.

- Refreshments will not be provided at the meetings due to agency restrictions.
- Meeting summaries will document comments from working group members and action items; they will not summarize presentations made by agency or other staff.
- All meeting materials will be posted on the program Web site (www.alaskanwayviaduct.org).
- The agenda for meetings will be sent out a week in advance; materials will be sent out in advance as appropriate and feasible.
- Meetings will be held in the downtown Seattle area; an A/V system will not be provided.
- The Seattle Channel will not be asked to record the meetings.
