In addition to these activities we also held a press conference on Jan. 13 where the Governor, King County Executive, and Seattle Mayor announced their recommendation for replacing the Alaskan Way Viaduct.

If you are interested in the general types of questions the public is asking or the comments they are providing I've highlighted a number of key points:\*

- Concerns about overall safety and egress in the bored tunnel in the event of an earthquake or fire.
- Questions about how transit improvements will impact surrounding communities.
- Questions about the cost of the project.
- Questions about the plan's ability to address future growth.
- Concerns from groups in north Seattle over movement on 15th Ave. and Mercer St.
- Concerns that the proposed project timeline is not realistic.
- Questions about general mobility in and around the bored tunnel.
- Questions about how the Alaskan Way Bored Tunnel differs from Boston's Big Dig.
- Questions about the type of soil where the tunnel will be constructed and tunneling technology in general.
- Questions about what will happen to the Battery Street Tunnel.
- Interest in the future design of Alaskan Way.
